

MozUp's SSHE Program Paves the Way for ISO Certification

MozUp has successfully sponsored and provided mentorship to nine companies that have achieved ISO certification, with four more in process.

To offer this opportunity to a wider number of small and medium enterprises (SMEs), MozUp launched its Safety, Security, Health and Environment (SSHE) Management Systems Training and Mentorship Program in March 2024.

Designed to foster a more pervasive health, safety, and security-oriented business culture in Mozambique and to improve management systems within companies, the SSHE program provides 20-days of customized training and mentorship delivered by leading experts.



The SSHE program serves as a distinct starting point for beginning a company's journey to achieving ISO 9001 and ISO 45001 compliance and certification.

Twenty Mozambican SMEs (10 from Maputo and 10 from Cabo Delgado) are currently engaged in the program.

ExxonMobil and Area 4 Partners Drive Energy Dialogue

The Area 4 Delegated Operators, Eni and ExxonMobil, recently participated in the Mozambique Energy and Industry Summit (MEIS) in Pemba. Event highlights included a panel discussion featuring Midstream General Manager Arne Gibbs and Upstream Managing Director and General Manager Marica Calabrese.



Gibbs highlighted ExxonMobil's commitment to sustainable practices and local content Mozambique, emphasizing MozUp's contributions to the development of SMEs in the country.

Mr. Mallon's visit included an audience with President Felipe Nyusi during which he highlighted ExxonMobil's commitment to its mega-project in Cabo Delgado.

promoting the visibility of their activities and networking opportunities.

It was noted the RLNG project has reached the FEED (Front End Engineering Design) phase. FEED is a critical step in large industrial projects, and a significant step in the process as the RLNG project moves forward.

"We're very excited about this," said Mallon. "Obviously, along the way, there have been some obstacles and things we've had to stop and start again. But we're pleased to be at the point where we're ready to start again. The RLNG project represents one of the largest investments in LNG globally," noted Mallon.



Mallon emphasized the project's significance, not only for its scale and its potential to generate substantial revenue [for Mozambique] over the coming decades, but also for its distinctive commitment to sustainability. "I assure you that this is going to be one of the lowest greenhouse gas emissions project in the world. That's very important to know,' he said.
